# You'll Need

# TOOLS

Needles:

# ABBREVIATIONS

K2Tog: Knit two stitches together

Yarn: CO: Cast On

Big Twist Yarn - 1 Skein STS: Stitches

Yarn Weight: Worsted, medium or #4 K: Knit

KITB: Knit next stitch through the back

US Size 6/4mm Circular Needle (16 inches) K3Tog: Knit three stitches together

US Size 6/4mm DPNs for finishing and cables. P2Tog: Purl two stitches together

or US Size 7/4.5mm circular and DPNs P3Tog: Purl three stitches together

Darning Needle for finishing C6F: Cable Six Front (See Below)
Stitch marker C4F: Cable 4 Front (See Below)

# Pattern Notes

Sizing: Small fits 24 inch head, Medium fits 25 inch head and Large fits 26 inch head.

Note: If you like a more fitted brim, cast on with a US Size 4 or 5 needle and work the following 1-14 rounds. Then switch to the larger US Size 6 needle. With my glasses, I tend to like a looser fitting brim.

# \*\*Helpful Hints: How to Knit a Cable\*\*

In the pattern below you'll see items like "C6F" which means you are about to knit a cable that involves six stitches. Here's how to do that:

C6F: Put the first three stitches on a cable needle and hold at the front of the work, knit the next three stitches, and then knit the three from cable needle.

C4F: Put the first two stitches on a cable needle and hold at the front of the work, knit the next two stitches, and then knit the two stitches from the cable needle.

# Begin Pattern

**Begin Pattern:** 

Cast On:

Small: 100 Stitches

Medium: 110 Large: 120

Loose Fitting Brim: Use US Size 6 needle.

Snug Brim: USE US Size 4 or 5 needle.

Slouchy Option: Use Small or Medium number for cast on, and then increase by multiples of 10 STS.

Join in the round, taking care to make sure that none of the stitches are twisted.

# **Place Stitch Marker**

Rounds 1-14: \*K1TB, P1\* Repeat until end of the round

Rounds 15 and 16: Either knit all stitches, Or, set up for the cable rounds by \*K6, P4\* Repeat until end of the round

### **Cable Pattern:**

Round 1: \*C6F, P4\* Repeat until end of the round Rounds 2-7: \*K6, P4\* Repeat until end of round Repeat the Cable pattern 4 times.

Your hat should measure around 7 inches - maybe a little more by now. This is where I like to start decreasing and shaping the crown of the hat, but you are welcome to knit another cable if you like more a slouchy hat.

**Decrease Section:** 

Round 1: \*C6F, P1, P2Tog, P1\* Repeat until end of the

round

Rounds 2-4: \*K6, P3\* Repeat until end of round

Round 5: \*K1, K2Tog, K2Tog, K1, P3\* Repeat until the

end of the round

Round 6 - 7: \*k4, P3\* Repeat until end of the round

Round 8: \*C4F, P3\*

Round 9: \*K4, P3Tog\* Repeat until end of the round

Round 10: \*K4, P1\* Repeat until end of the round

Round 11: \*K1, K2Tog, K1, P1\* Repeat until end of the

round

Round 12: \*K3Tog, P1\* Repeat until end of the round

Round 13: \*K2Tog\* Repeat until end of round

Break yarn and thread through the remaining live stitches. Pull the yarn tight and knot it as you prefer.

Use Tapestry needle to weave in the tails of yarn.

If you'd like a little bit of flare or fun you can add a pompom to the hat, but I'd recommend hand washing it if you do.
